

DECEMBER 2021 WOODLAWN PARK CITY COUNCIL MEETING

The Woodlawn Park City Council met on Monday, December 20, 2021 at City Hall. Present were: Mayor Larry Lewis, Council Members: Mike Brown, Greg Claypool, George Langford, Tom Nunn, Ed Purcell, and Doug Watson. Also in attendance were Chief Mike Koenig, Gloria Curran, Pat Merrick and Attorney, Matt Carey.

Mayor Larry Lewis called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a roll call of Council Members.

The Council reviewed the minutes for the November 2021 meeting. Tom Nunn made a motion to accept the minutes and Ed Purcell seconded the motion. All voted aye and the minutes were accepted.

The Council reviewed the Treasurer's Report for November 2021. Doug Watson made a motion to accept the report and Mike Brown seconded the motion. All voted aye and the Treasurer's Report was accepted.

Daniel Weber gave the Audit Report for the City of Woodlawn Park.

Pat Merrick had nothing to report.

Chief Mike Koenig gave his report. City Citations: 1, City Warnings: 28, State Citations: 6, All Assists: 30, Police Backup: 1, Arrests: 0, Miscellaneous: 6, Reports: 2. Gasoline: \$152.76, Gallons: 49.531.

Chief Koenig broke down this information: 23 Parking on the street, 2 unapproved construction, 1 debris limbs in yard, 1 lot maintenance, 1 inoperative, unlicensed, or discarded vehicle, 6 speeding – 3 in a school zone traveling 57, 55 & 52 in 35 MPH zone – 3 traveling 60 MPH in a 45 MPH zone. 2 reports taken – 1 theft of firearm and X-box, 1 theft of storage shed involving a pole saw and table saw. *Through his investigation, he was able to recover all stolen property except for the gun. He will file criminal charges.

Variance Request: Kevin Estes requested a variance for a permit for a shed at 6819 Green Meadow Circle. It will replace 2 smaller sheds. Mike Brown made a motion to accept the variance, all voted aye and the variance was accepted.

New Business: Woodlawn Park does not have an encroachment permit regarding AT & T Fiber Optic replacement. Mike Brown introduced the Ordinance for Encroachment Permit. Pat Merrick read the Ordinance. The second reading will be at the January, 2022 meeting.

The house at 6942 Ambridge Circle is still owned by the bank. It is set to be auctioned on January 18, 2022 at the Jefferson County Commissioner's Sale.

The Mayor and Chief Koenig are going to meet with Council Person McCraney regarding the speed limit on Westport Road. The state is not interested in lowering it. George Langford said he would like to attend the meeting also.

The Mayor discussed the Western Kentucky Disaster in which 76 people died. The Council discussed making a donation.

The Mayor announced that Rob Tony on Middlebrook passed away.

New Moves and Rentals: The house at 4244 Middlebrook closed on December 12, 2021. There is one other listing and it is under contract.

Fence and Building Permits: Mike Brown reported that the variance for Kevin Estes is the only permit for this month.


Drainage and Block Watch: George Langford had a resident ask about cleaning out a neighbor's culvert. He went to "Muffins with McCraney" this month.


Community Activities: Ed Purcell thanked everyone who helped him with judging the 2021 Holiday Decoration Winners. The winners are:
