

NOVEMBER 2022 WOODLAWN PARK CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

The Woodlawn Park City Council met in person on Monday, November 21, 2022. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a roll call of Council Members.

The Council reviewed the Minutes for October 2022. Mike Brown made a motion to accept the minutes and Nancye Claypool seconded the motion. All voted aye and the Minutes were accepted.
